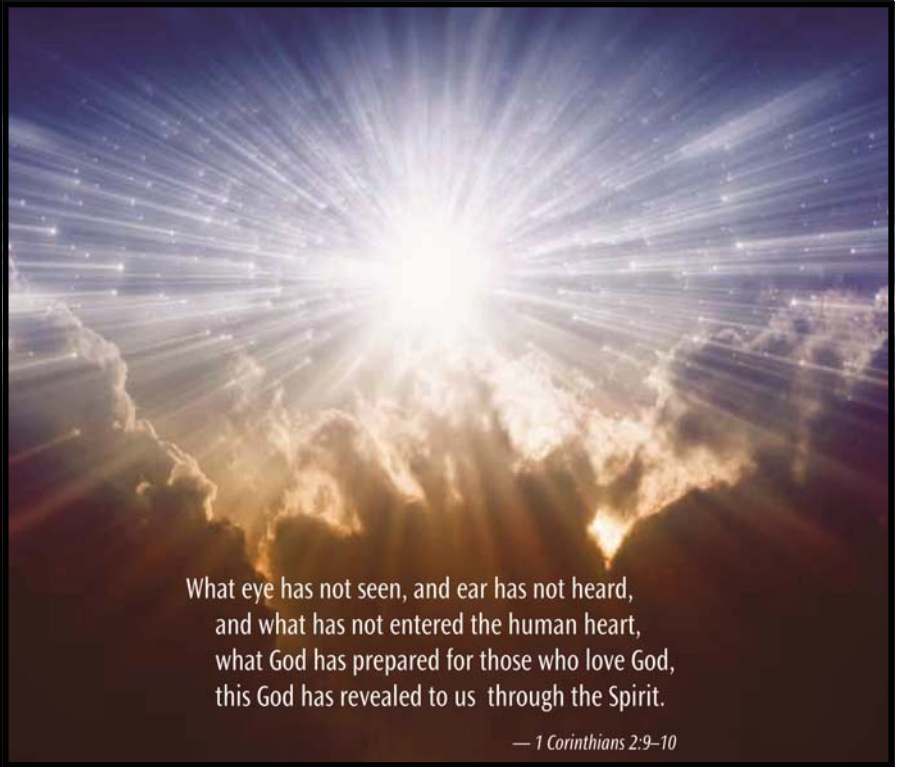

## **LA LEY Y LA VIDA DEL CRISTIANO.**

Jesús en estos domingos continúa con su mensaje del sermón del monte y hoy nos recuerda que no ha venido a quitar la ley, sino a darle cumplimiento, plenitud dice El exactamente. Los cristianos debemos conocer las leyes tanto cristianas como civiles y no ser simplemente cumplidores ciegos de ellas. Y recordando que la ley de Jesús es el Amor que pretende dar vida siempre.

Las leyes deben ser puestas siempre al servicio de la persona, nunca al revés. Una ley que, cumplida literalmente, haga daño, físico, social o moral, a alguna persona, no es una ley cristianamente buena y, en consecuencia, los cristianos no deberemos cumplirla literalmente. Una ley puede haber sido escrita para el bien pero la forma en como la cumplen resulta inaceptable y es precisamente lo que paso en tiempos de Jesús y la Ley por ejemplo de Moisés. Era la forma en como la cumplían los fariseos lo que Jesús no aceptaba.

Lo que Jesús les decía a sus discípulos era que él no sólo no había venido a abolir el espíritu de la Ley de Moisés, sino que había venido, precisamente, a perfeccionar la Ley, a darle plenitud. La expresión que usa Jesús es muy clara: “han oído que se dijo..., pero yo les digo”. Los letrados y fariseos del tiempo de Jesús querían aplicar la Ley de Moisés literalmente, perjudicando en muchos casos a las personas más débiles, entre ellas, a las mujeres, a los enfermos y a los pecadores. Jesús les dice a sus discípulos que, en su origen, el espíritu de la Ley de Moisés siempre fue ayudar a las personas más débiles y que así es como quiere él que se cumpla y se dé cumplimiento a la Ley de Moisés. Pensemos en la interpretación que Jesús hacía sobre las leyes referidas al descanso sabático, o sobre la conducta de Jesús frente a la mujer sorprendida en adulterio, como ejemplos más claros. En el evangelio de hoy Jesús les pone cuatro ejemplos concretos: las leyes sobre el asesinato, el adulterio, el divorcio y los juramentos. En todos estos casos, Jesús quiere que la Ley de Moisés sea interpretada según la intención y el espíritu con el que fueron dadas estas leyes, cosa que los letrados y fariseos de su tiempo no estaban haciendo. Nosotros, los cristianos, somos discípulos de Jesús, no de Moisés, y debemos cumplir siempre las leyes atendiendo al espíritu de la ley, que no puede ser otro que ayudar a las personas a hacer el bien.

Si quieres, guardarás sus mandatos, porque es prudencia cumplir su voluntad; ante ti están puestos fuego y agua, echa mano de lo que quieras. En este texto del libro del Eclesiástico, el autor defiende la libertad del ser humano, frente a los que decían que “se habían desviado por culpa del Señor”. El Señor siempre aborrece el pecado, premia al que hace el bien y castiga al que hace el mal. Hoy día nosotros hablamos mucho de libertad, pero nunca debemos confundir la libertad con el libertinaje. Usar nuestra libertad como Dios quiere es cumplir la voluntad de Dios, es decir, usar nuestra libertad para hacer el bien y rechazar el mal. Es cierto que la libertad humana es muy frágil y está muy limitada por múltiples circunstancias, pero, en la medida en la que somos libres, Dios quiere que usemos siempre bien nuestra libertad; libertad, repito, para hacer el bien, cumpliendo la voluntad de Dios.

**DIOS ES INMENSAMENTE SABIO, INFINITAMENTE PODEROSO.** Él es capaz de hacer libre al hombre, de darle una voluntad apta para la lucha, para querer, para decidirse por una cosa o por otra. Bien o mal, aunque a veces queriendo hacer el bien sale algo malo, pero la intención era el bien. Paz y Bien.

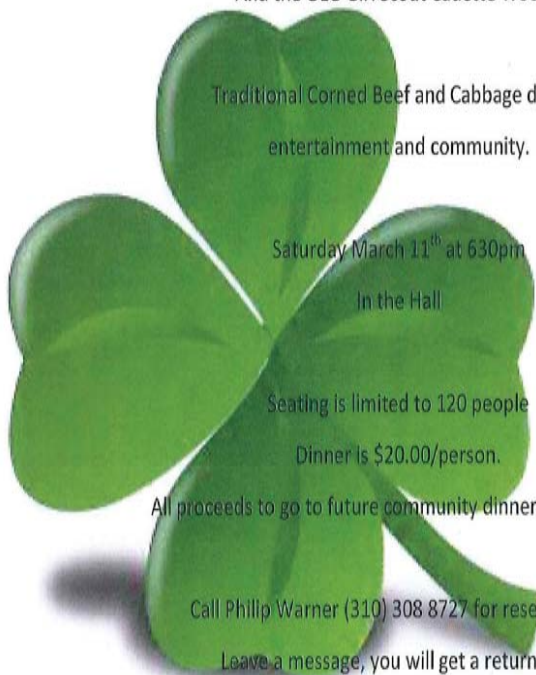

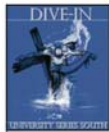
