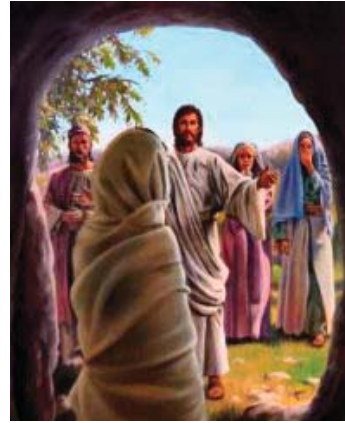

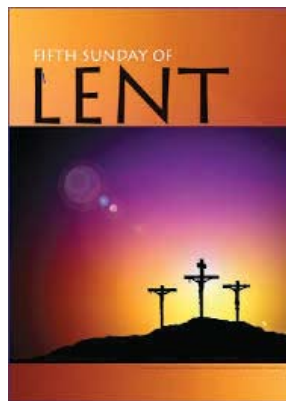

Fifth Sunday of Lent Reflection



Lent is a season of reflection, re-evaluation, repentance and reconciliation. Lent is a time of profound grace and we are invited to let that grace sink in, take root and change us. Through our observance of these days by listening to the Scripture from the Lenten liturgies and by participating in the traditional practices of the Church, we are invited, in this holy season, to be stripped down and cleansed from all the obstacles that keep us from seeing our true selves clearly; stripped down so that we may come to understand more powerfully the Love of God who embraces all of who we are. There are many ways to enter into the spirit of the season and to "observe" these days. It is not so important what we do as it is important that we do something to make these days different from all the rest. One great way to enter into this season is by following the traditional practices of the Church which are: prayer, fasting and almsgiving. What is great about these practices is that they give us a way to enter into this season of healing with body and soul; physically and spiritually.

ESPERANZA RENOVADORA

Tan solo a unos días de la semana santa, Dios nos habla directamente sobre el amor, perdón, misericordia y es así como se asoma la libertad y la paz. Jesús acoge con todo el amor del mundo a esta mujer a quienes los encargados de la ley y los que se creían buenos la condenaban, la perseguían con intención de matarla.

Esta experiencia nos tiene que hacer ver la vida y a los demás con una esperanza más renovadora, mas nueva, salvífica, esperanzadora. No todo es ley por ley, con Jesús es la ley del Amor, del perdón, de la misericordia y sobre todo la ley del compromiso, vete y en adelante no peques más.

Los letrados y fariseos que son los que la persiguen y posiblemente se creen mejor que ella, se creen puros, sin pecado son los que la colocan frente a Jesús con la intención de ver cómo responde Jesús. Más no se imaginan que el juicio se les devolverá a ellos mismos.

Pero Jesús guarda silencio, omite la condena y vuelca en ella toda la misericordia de Dios, lo que hace que hasta los más viejos del lugar den un paso atrás y se retiren, dejando a la mujer sola con Jesús. “¿Ninguno te ha condenado? Tampoco yo te condeno”. Aquella mujer fue renovada por el perdón de Dios, que le dio nuevas esperanzas a su vida.

Sólo un amor que no juzga nos deja con esa sensación preciosa de vivir en libertad y con nuestra dignidad intacta, ya que un amor así nos dignifica y es un estímulo para vivir nuestra fe. Pero esto requiere un paso de madurez en nuestra fe, una gran dosis de conversión y de esperanza.

Nos dará mucha luz en este sentido la segunda lectura, las palabras de ánimo que San Pablo da a los cristianos de Filipos, a los que tanto quiere, y también a nosotros que hemos escuchado con atención esta Palabra. Pablo dice que vive la fe como si de una carrera se tratara, y que el amor y la entrega son el esfuerzo que él pone para llegar a la meta. Pero ese esfuerzo no es una condición para alcanzar la salvación, sino que es como fruto de ella, es decir, corre sabiendo que ya tiene ganada la carrera, y ese esfuerzo se convierte en amor y en entrega libre y generosa hacia los demás, y no en una carga voluntarista y pesada que termina por no dar vida.

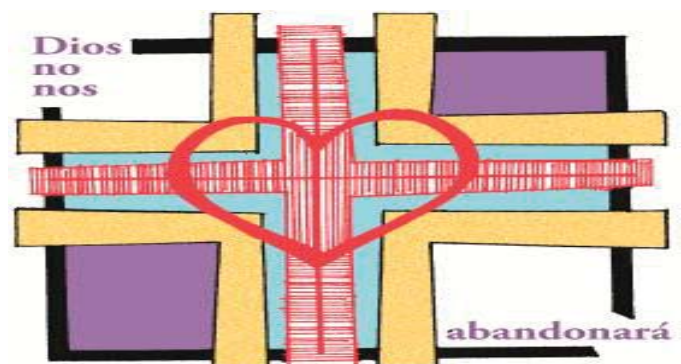
¿Nuestra fe es así? ¿Vivimos la fe desde el amor y la entrega a los demás como fruto de la salvación que Dios nos regala en Cristo? ¿Estamos convencidos de que la salvación es gratuita y de que no nos viene por los muchos y grandes esfuerzos que nosotros podamos hacer? ¿Convertimos nuestros esfuerzos por “correr en la carrera de la fe” en amor y entrega generosa y libre a los demás? ¿O seguimos pensando en clave voluntarista y condenatoria de los que no son ni piensan como nosotros?

“No recuerden lo de antes –dice el profeta Isaías en la primera lectura–, miren que realizo algo nuevo, ya está brotando, ¿no lo notan?”. Frente a la situación de destierro del pueblo, el profeta invita a poner la mirada en la liberación de Dios. Se trata de no quedarse anclado en la situación de dolor actual, sin fortalecer la esperanza. Esa acción liberadora de Dios, ese “algo nuevo” es Jesús que vivió su vida desde el amor y la libertad y que vino a mostrarnos a un Dios que no quiere nuestra condena, sino nuestra salvación, y que nos quiere libres, y no sometidos a unas prácticas y unas leyes que nos atan porque no las vivimos desde el amor y la libertad.

En la Eucaristía, cada domingo, recordamos la entrega generosa de Jesús, anunciamos su muerte y proclamamos su resurrección. Nos unimos a Él al comulgar su Cuerpo y nos comprometemos a vivir nuestra fe en la vida desde el amor y la libertad que Él nos enseñó y sin perder la esperanza en un mundo mejor. Ya se acerca nuestra liberación. Esperamos su venida Gloriosa!!!!

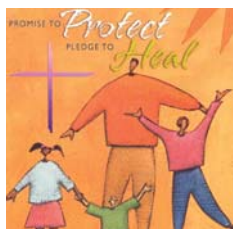

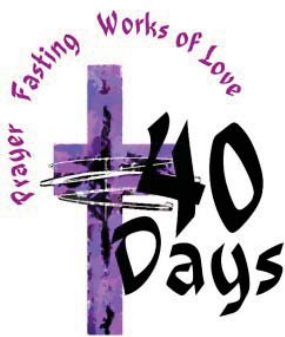

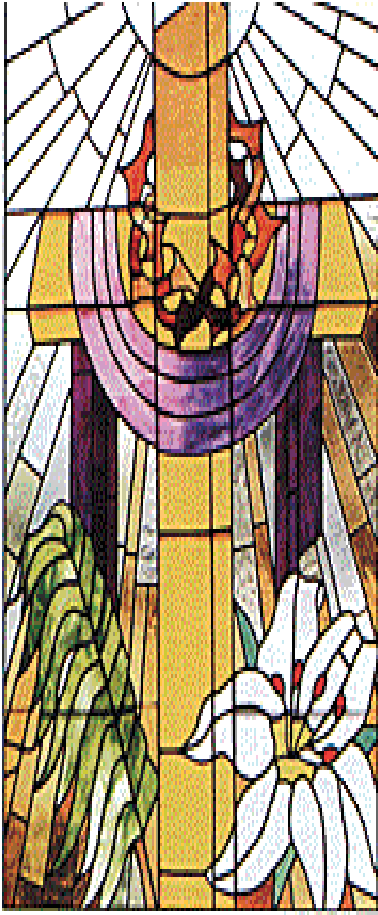
