ANETODO...FE, domingode la Divina Misericordia.

Segundo domingo de Pascua y, el Señor, se aparece. Unos creen porque han visto el sepulcro vacío, porque reconociendo su voz recuerdan aquellas palabras “volveré” y otros, aun con dificultades, porque tienen una inmensa fe en Aquel que vino en el nombre del Señor. Creer, no es tarea fácil.

1.- ¿Cómo están las puertas de nuestras entrañas? ¿Abiertas o cerradas a la fe? ¿Dispuestas abrirse a Cristo Resucitado o chiriando porque, hace tiempo, dejaron de ser bañadas por la oración, la esperanza, la fe o la caridad?

Estamos en Pascua. ¡Resucitó el Señor y nos llama a la vida! ¡Señor qué vea! ¡Señor, que viva! ¡Señor, que crea en ti! Deben ser exclamaciones que broten desde lo más hondo de nuestras ganas de celebrar, sentir y vivir a Jesús.

Hoy, más que nunca, como los apóstoles teníamos que decir: “hemos visto al Señor”. Y, aunque algunos –con intereses mezquinos y destructivos– intenten callar o desautorizar la voz de la Iglesia, hemos de responder con la fuerza de nuestra fe, con el entusiasmo activo y efectivo de nuestro testimonio cristiano. No podemos dejarnos llevar por murmuraciones que entre otras cosas debilitan, pero no consiguen su propósito: herir y a conciencia. Minar lo que, por cierto, es algo inquebrantable y sólido: CRISTO NOS ACOMPAÑA EN NUESTRA PASION Y MUERTE, PARA LLEARNOS A UN MAÑANA FELIZ. También, a nuestra Iglesia, le espera.

2.- Hoy, como a Santo Tomás, nos puede ocurrir lo mismo: que nos cueste ver al Señor en el contexto que nos toca vivir. Pero, mira por donde, es en la realidad sufriente, en el costado por donde sangra la Iglesia, donde hemos de incrustar nuestros dedos para comprobar que, Cristo, sigue vive dentro de ella. Que la razón de su ser, el de la Iglesia, es precisamente anunciar –con santidad pero a veces con alguna debilidad- la gran noticia del evangelio: ¡Ha resucitado! ¡Vive entre nosotros!

3.- En este Año de la Fe, con Santo Tomás, hacemos un acto de confianza: “Señor mío y Dios mío”. Creo en tu Iglesia, amo y rezo por la santidad y entrega de sus sacerdotes y, sobre todo, sigo creyendo porque sé que, el paso del Señor por el mundo, no ha sido inútil. Tuvo un objetivo: sacarnos del pecado, curarnos las enfermedades del alma y atraernos, como si de un imán se tratara, al abrazo amoroso de Dios. Y, eso, nadie nos lo puede eclipsar o eliminar.

Qué sugerente la primera lectura de este día. Los primeros cristianos tenían un pensamiento común (Cristo), un ideario de comunión (el de Cristo), compartían de una forma llamativa (como les enseñó Cristo) pero, sobre todo, daban testimonio de la Resurrección de Cristo. Que también nosotros, con esa Iglesia que nació de Cristo, seamos capaces de ir al fondo de nuestra vida cristiana: no nos podemos intoxicar o perder en el humo. Hay que irradiar al mundo el fuego del Espíritu, la alegría de la fe y la presencia de Jesús Resucitado. Tal vez, por ello mismo, a muchos...les encantaría una Iglesia temerosa, débil o acomplejada. FELIZ DOMINGO DE LA DIVINA MISERICORDIA.!!!!

DIVINA MISERICORDIA.

Oh Dios de gran misericordia!, bondad infinita, desde el abismo de su abatimiento, toda la humanidad implora hoy Tu misericordia, Tu compasión, ¡Oh Dios!; y clama con la potente voz de la desdicha. ¡Dios de Benevolencia, no desoigas la oración de este exilio terrenal! ¡Oh señor!, Bondad que escapa nuestra comprensión, que conoces nuestra miseria a fondo y sabes que con nuestras fuerzas no podemos elevarnos a Ti, Te lo imploramos: Adelante con Tu gracia y continúa aumentando Tu misericordia en nosotros, para que podamos, fielmente, cumplir Tu santa voluntad, a lo largo de nuestra vida y a la hora de la muerte. Que la omnipotencia de tu misericordia nos escude de las flechas que arrojan los enemigos de nuestra salvación, para que con confianza, como hijos tuyos, aguardemos la última venida (día que Tú solo sabes). Y esperamos obtener lo que Jesús nos prometió a pesar de nuestra mezquindad. Porque Jesús es nuestra esperanza: A través de su Corazón misericordioso, como en el Reino de los Cielos.

ORACIÓN

Oh Dios, cuya Misericordia es infinita y cuyos tesoros de compasión no tienen límites, míranos con Tu favor y aumenta Tu Misericordia dentro de nosotros, para que en nuestras grandes ansiedades no desesperemos, sino que siempre, con gran confianza, nos conformemos con Tu Santa Voluntad, la cual es idéntica con Tu Misericordia, por Nuestro Señor Jesucristo, Rey de Misericordia, quien con Vos y el Espíritu Santo manifiesta Misericordia hacia nosotros por siempre. Amén.

El Salvador ordenó a Sor María Faustina que escribiera, y la rezara con frecuencia, esta pequeña jaculatoria: "Oh Sangre y Agua, que brotaste del Sagrado Corazón de Jesús como una Fuente de Misericordia para nosotros, yo confío en vos".

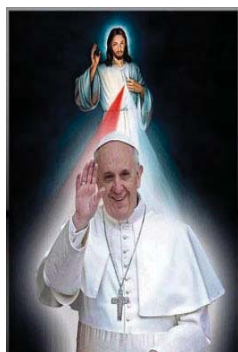
PARA REZAR A LAS TRES DE LA TARDE

Expiraste, Jesús, pero Tu muerte hizo brotar un manantial de vida para las almas y el océano de Tu misericordia inundó todo el mundo. Oh, Fuente de Vida, insondable misericordia divina, anega el mundo entero derramando sobre nosotros hasta Tu última gota de sangre. (IV, 59).

Oh, Sangre y Agua que brotaste del Corazón de Jesús, manantial de misericordia para nosotros, en Ti confío. (1, 35).

1. El origen de esta devoción es muy reciente y se debe a Sor María Faustina Kowalska. Elena Kowalska, nació en Glogowice en 1905, cerca de Cracovia, en Polonia. Unas pocas semanas antes de su vigésimo cumpleaños, entro a la Congregación de las Hermanas de Nuestra Señora de Misericordia con el nombre María Faustina. A partir de 1931 y hasta 1938, año de su muerte, sor Faustina, tuvo una serie de revelaciones de Jesús la cuales dejó por escrito en un diario compuesto por más de 600 páginas. Durante casi veinte años esta devoción estuvo prohibida, pero desde el 15 de abril de 1978 la Santa Sede dio su autorización a la práctica de la devoción. Fue beatificada el 18 de abril de 1993 por S. S. Juan Pablo II y proclamada santa el 30 de abril de 2000. La fiesta de la misericordia se celebra el domingo siguiente al de Pascua de Resurrección.

La encíclica sobre la misericordia divina ("Dives in misericordia", 30 de septiembre de 1980) subraya como función principal de la Iglesia proclamarla, practicarla y pedirla. El 22 de septiembre de 1981 el Papa Juan Pablo II dijo en el Santuario del Amor Misericordioso, sito en Collevanzena (Italia): "Desde el principio de mi Pontificado he considerado este mensaje como mi cometido especial. La Providencia me lo ha asignado".



Divine Mercy Sunday

Last year on this Sunday, Pope Francis declared this year a Jubilee Year of Mercy. Saint John Paul II named the Second Sunday of Easter "Sunday of Divine Mercy" in response to Saint Faustina Kowalska's Divine Mercy devotion, which offered spiritual

comfort to hearts worldwide. But Francis challenges us to make that comfort we receive a gift we gladly share: "We are called to show mercy because mercy has first been shown to us." The clearest expression of merciful love, says Francis, is pardoning others. "At times how hard it seems to forgive!" he acknowledges. "And yet pardon is the instrument placed into our fragile hands to attain serenity of heart" (*Misericordiae Vultus*, 9). The necessary condition for living joyfully? "To let go of anger, wrath, violence, and revenge." May Divine Mercy Sunday in this Jubilee Year of Mercy remind us that Jesus made mercy our life's ideal and a criterion for our faith's credibility: "Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy" (Matt

Do Not Be Afraid



Did you notice? Today is called the "Second Sunday of Easter," not

the "First Sunday after Easter." Our celebration of Easter is not over. These Sundays of Easter continue to present the mystery of Jesus Christ's victory.

The readings begin with the "signs and wonders" abounding in those earliest days. Sick people lay in the street, hoping that at least Peter's "shadow might fall on one or another of them." Then, in a powerful passage from the book of Revelation, the visionary falls down "as though dead" upon seeing the victorious Christ. But Christ extends a gentle touch: "Do not be afraid . . . once I was dead, but now I am alive forever."

In the Gospel, that same Christ appears and breathes on the disciples, and gently leads Thomas to believe. This Christ—more powerful than any evil force, victorious over death

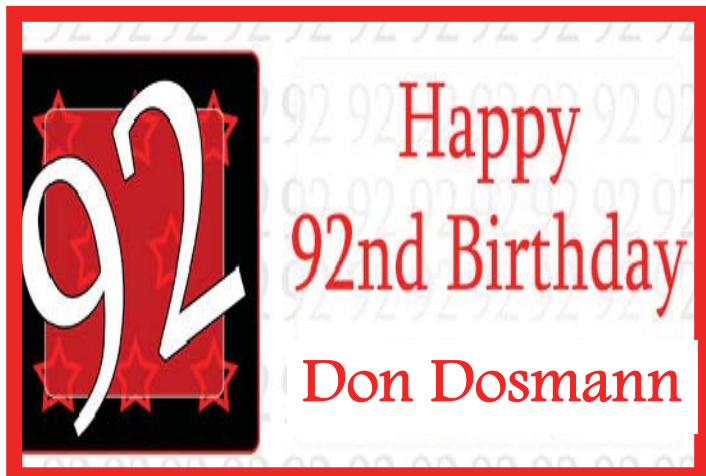
