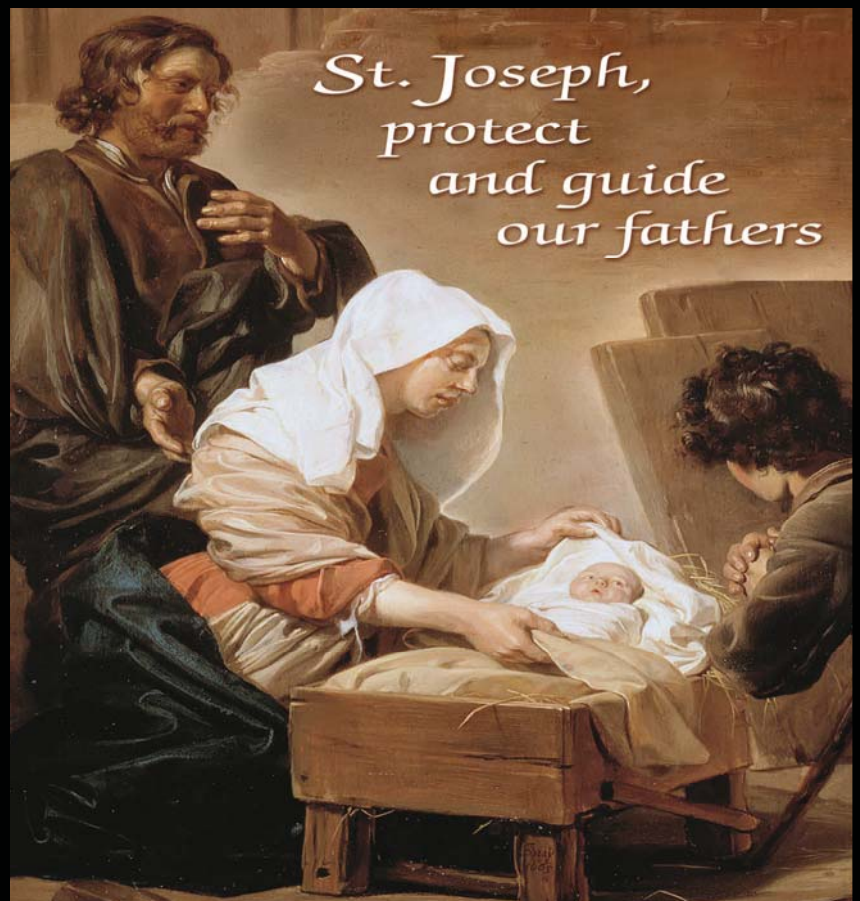

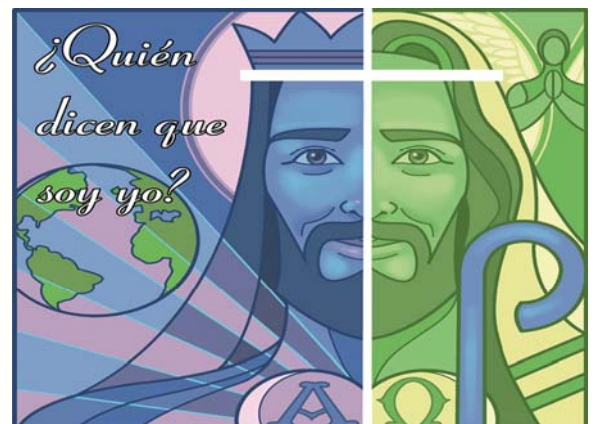
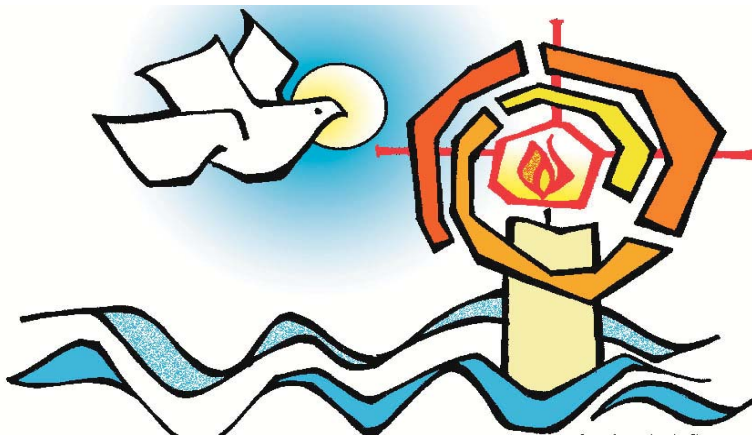
RENUNCIAR, TOMAR LA CRUZ Y SEGUIRLE

Las preguntas generalmente esperan una respuesta y hoy estamos ante una interesante pregunta, Quien dice la gente que soy YO? O y Tu Quien dices que Soy YO? Jesús espera la respuesta. El que entre ellos se lanza a responder es Pedro, la que conocemos como la confesión de Pedro. Las respuestas son variadas, pero van en tono personal también. Y hoy se nos hace a nosotros también, es a título personal, por lo visto, según las respuestas a Jesús lo ven como alguien que encierra un misterio, que tiene que ver con el Pasado pues es comparado con los antiguos? A esto responden los discípulos: “Unos dicen que Juan el Bautista, otros que Elías, Jeremías o uno de los profetas.” Lo evidente es que la gente percibe a Jesús como un hombre santo, en línea con los profetas. En este momento crítico de la historia de la salvación judía, le ven como portavoz de Dios.

Es el Mesías largamente esperado, el Ungido de Dios, realmente el Hijo mismo de Dios. Conociéndole y permaneciendo con él, Pedro y los apóstoles poseen la auténtica presencia de Dios, aquella “luz atractiva” imposible de despreciar y de renunciar. Es interesante como el actuar de la persona identifica lo que es, por eso estamos llamados a actuar con el bien, la verdad, la justicia, el amor. Para ser identificados como seguidores de Jesús, como cristianos católicos.

“El que quiera seguirme, que se niegue a sí mismo, cargue con su cruz cada día y se venga conmigo”. Son tres las condiciones que Cristo pone: renunciar a sí mismo, tomar la cruz y seguirle. La primera es la más difícil de comprender. El hombre tiene arraigado en el profundo de su ser la tendencia a pensar en sí mismo, a poner la propia persona en el centro de los intereses y a ponerse como medida de todo. ¿Cómo, entonces, se le ocurre a Jesús pedir al hombre, y más aún al joven, que renuncie a sí mismo, a su vida, a sus planes? Jesús no pide que se renuncie a vivir, sino que se acoja una novedad y una plenitud de vida que sólo Él puede dar. He aquí el elemento que nos hace entender las palabras evangélicas. No se nos pide renunciar, sino todo lo contrario. Cuando el seguimiento del Señor se convierte en el valor supremo, entonces todos los otros valores reciben de aquel su justa colocación e importancia. Renunciar a sí mismo significa renunciar al propio proyecto, con frecuencia limitado y mezquino, para acoger el de Dios. Pero debemos entenderlo correctamente. Ante nuestros proyectos limitados y mezquinos se encuentra la plenitud del proyecto de Dios. ¿En qué consiste esta plenitud? En primer lugar, ante el limitado plan humano del tener y poseer bienes, Dios nos ofrece la plenitud de ser un bien para los demás. En realidad, el Señor no quiere que rechacemos los bienes, por el contrario desea que nosotros nos convirtamos en un bien y usemos de lo material en la medida que nos ayude a ser ese bien para los demás. La vida verdadera se expresa en el don de sí mismo.

Hoy sigue siendo válida esta propuesta que Jesús hizo, y la hace hoy a nosotros, valoremos bien esta triple dimensión que Jesús presenta, lo estaremos haciendo? Estamos dispuestos a vivir comprometidamente el Evangelio y sus exigencias. Todo esto es de Vida Eterna y si queremos el Cielo Prometido, también debemos trabajar aquí en la tierra con lo que Jesús nos enseñó, aún estamos a tiempo. “Hagamos, porque hasta Ahora poco o nada hemos hecho”. (San Francisco de Asís)

Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Today, as he often does, Luke portrays Jesus "praying in solitude" (Luke 9:18). The Jubilee Year of Mercy invites us to rediscover the value of silence as the prayerful setting in which to reflect on the ways in which God's mercy transforms our lives, in order to make

mercy the heart of our own lifestyle. But in a line that sounds odd, Jesus "rebuked" his disciples "and directed them not to tell anyone" (9:20-21) after they professed their faith in Jesus as "the Christ of God" (9:20). Jesus challenges us also to profess our faith not by what we say, but by what we do: take up our own cross daily (9:23) and "bear one another's burdens" (Galatians 6:2). Our gratitude for God's mercy toward us should make us instruments of God's mercy toward all. Then, as Zechariah prophesies in today's first reading, the fountain of God's mercy will open to purify the whole world from the sin and selfishness that cause suffering and sorrow to so many (Zechariah 13:1).



Each year, the annual Peter's Pence collection, in support of the works of the Holy Father, is held in parishes across the country. The

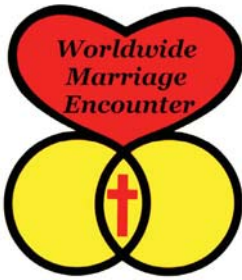
proceeds from this collection fund emergency relief assistance to those throughout the world who suffer from war, oppression, and natural disasters.

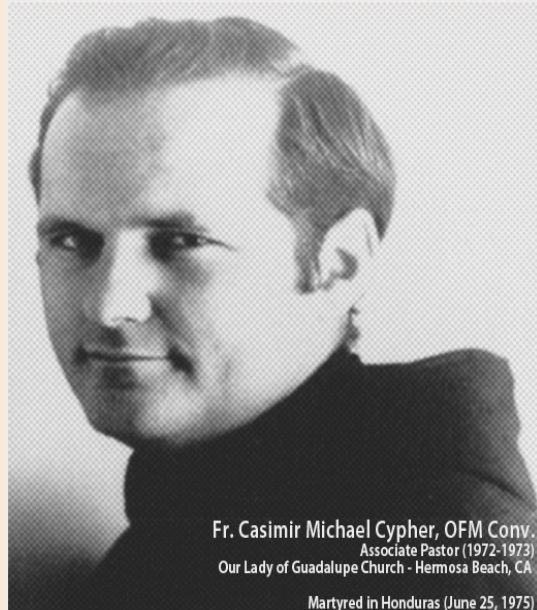

Fr. Casimir Michael Cypher, OFM Conv.
Associate Pastor (1972-1973)
Our Lady of Guadalupe Church - Hermosa Beach, CA
Martyred in Honduras (June 25, 1975)

Fr. Casimir Michael Cypher OFM Conv. is the first U.S. citizen to die by violence for the Catholic faith in Latin America during our century. Fr. Casimir was a Conventual Franciscan, Associate Pastor at Our Lady of Guadalupe Church and a Missionary in Honduras, Central America, in the 1970's. His death was very similar to the death of Jesus. He too was stripped down, publicly humiliated, tortured and killed. The date of martyrdom is June 25, 1975. Fr. Casimir was 34 years old. A Martyr is a witness to the truth of the faith, in which the martyr endures even death to be faithful to Christ. Fr. Casimir Cypher has not been recognized as an official martyr of the Church. Fr. Casimir is our martyr. You can read more about Fr. Casimir in a book entitled "*Man of Peace*" by Fr. Anselm Romb, OFM Conv.

This is one of many meditations by Father Casimir Cypher:

"What is important is not that we wait for a revelation in some book or in some saying, but take the revelation we have in our everyday life. And the revelation in our everyday life is to use the talents God gave us. Lazarus had no 'talents' — but what he was, he was. And that was all.

"There is beauty in life if we only worry about living completely and just being truly what God meant us to be. We miss it when we worry about not being really great, about accomplishing things we cannot accomplish. When we want God to make us greater than we are, we become smaller, because we neglect what we have and what we are already.

"Remember this Gospel. It is a sort of warning: Don't look too far into the future. When you look into eternity, don't look on forever; you will stumble over your own life. Look for eternity in those who are near you right now. For eternity begins today; it begins this moment. It begins right NOW!"
