- ★ *Do something for the poor. Use some container to make a daily sacrifice for the poor. The amount is not important. What is important is the practice of helping others. Then at Christmas, bring your gift (maybe wrap it) and present it to the Christ Child in our Church manger.*

LA ESPERANZA CRISTIANA EN TIEMPOS DE CRISIS

Hemos terminado el ciclo C en nuestro Año litúrgico e iniciamos el nuevo año litúrgico siempre con el tiempo de adviento, que son 4 semanas en preparación a celebrar el gran acontecimiento del Nacimiento de Cristo, El Salvador del Mundo. Estamos ahora en el ciclo A y nuestro evangelista será San Mateo por este año.

La invitación del adviento en el primero domingo es estén en vela porque no saben que día vendrá el Señor. Es adviento un tiempo de esperanza cristiana es vivir esperando que Cristo reinará un día en nuestro mundo. Creer que Cristo terminará reinando en nuestro mundo es creer que llegará un día en el que el bien triunfe sobre el mal, la justicia sobre la injusticia, la paz sobre la guerra. Desde el punto de vista litúrgico, el Adviento es el tiempo que los cristianos dedicamos a prepararnos para poder celebrar dignamente el día de Navidad. Pero el Adviento, en general, es más que el Adviento litúrgico, es vivir todos los días de nuestra vida animados por la esperanza de que algún día Dios nacerá entre nosotros y se quedará para siempre con nosotros, de tal manera que podremos vivir aquí en la tierra como auténticos hijos de Dios. Esto, desde nuestra condición de hombres y mujeres pecadores, es difícil de esperar, y en tiempos de crisis lo es aún más. Porque si miramos a nuestro alrededor, al mundo en el que realmente vivimos, vemos muy pocas señales de que esto vaya a suceder en un futuro cercano. En nuestro mundo de hoy no es Dios el que gobierna, ni en nuestra economía, ni en nuestra convivencia social y política, ni en el ámbito diario de nuestros valores y de nuestros quehaceres habituales. Pero decir que nuestra esperanza cristiana en estos tiempos de crisis es muy difícil de mantener, no es decir que debemos renunciar a ella, sino todo lo contrario. Los hombres que vivían en tiempos de Cristo y que mataron a Cristo no eran mucho mejores que nosotros; también Cristo vivió en un tiempo de crisis: crisis política, crisis social, crisis económica, crisis moral. Y, sin embargo, Cristo luchó hasta el último momento de su vida para que el reino de Dios se hiciera realidad. Él mismo puso en marcha ese reino, el reino de Dios. Nosotros, como discípulos de Cristo, tenemos la obligación de seguir trabajando para que ese reino iniciado por Cristo pueda hacerse realidad también entre nosotros. Así lo esperamos y así se lo pedimos a Dios nuestro Padre en este tiempo de Adviento: que Cristo pueda seguir naciendo y reinando entre nosotros. A pesar de todas las crisis. También el profeta Isaías, el gran cantor de la esperanza cristiana en el Antiguo Testamento, nos dijo, en nombre de Dios, que un día será el mismo Dios el que nos instruirá en sus caminos, nos guiará por sus sendas, y ese día podremos hacer de las lanzas podaderas y de las espadas arados. Pero para eso nosotros deberemos dejarnos guiar por su luz, abandonar nuestros oscuros caminos de egoísmo, injusticia y violencia. Y ser anunciadores de salvación y de gracia.

En este primer domingo de Adviento comenzamos un camino de purificación interior, para poder llegar al día de Navidad totalmente limpios de pecado y llenos de la gracia de Dios. Para eso, Dios se encarnó en el hombre Jesús de Nazaret, para redimirnos del pecado que está dentro de cada uno de nosotros y enseñarnos la verdadera Verdad y el verdadero Camino para llegar a la verdadera Vida, la vida que está en Dios y es Dios mismo. No desperdiciemos este tiempo de Adviento, encendamos la vela de nuestra esperanza cristiana y caminemos, alegres, al encuentro de nuestro Dios. A pesar de todas las crisis en las que nos está tocando vivir. **PREPAREMOS NUESTROS HOGARES PARA CRISTO**

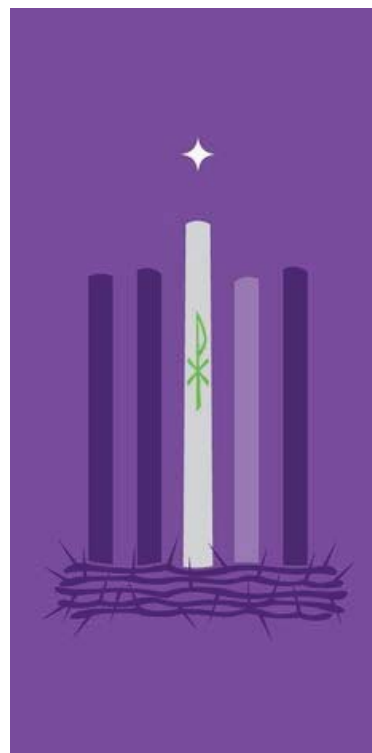
Baptisms In December

The Purple of Advent

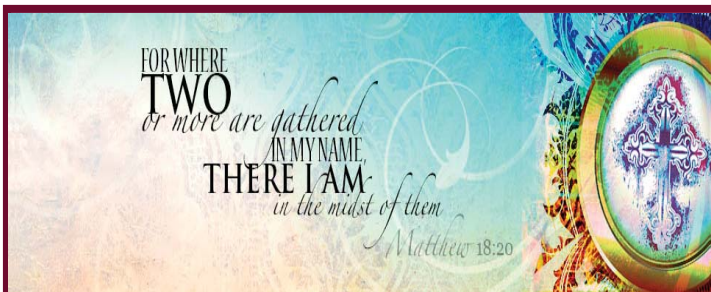
