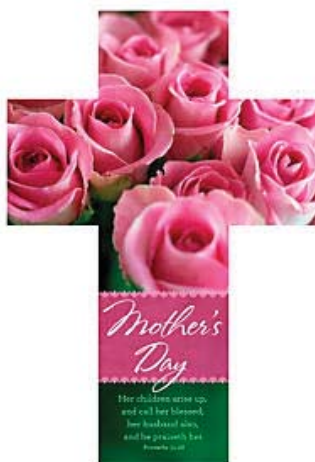
***Fiesta

## ***EL GESTO INCONFUNDIBLE***

Hoy escuchamos este pasaje evangelico muy conocido y hasta cantado por nosotros, “el Peregrino de Emaus” o los peregrinos. Seguramente que muchos de nosotros hemos pasado por algo parecido. En este tiempo de Pascua hacemos el esfuerzo de mirar con fe nuestra vida para descubrir al Resucitado, que camina con nosotros todos los días. Pero, en ocasiones, no somos capaces de ver. Jesús se acerca a aquellos dos discípulos que regresan a Emaús tristes y decepcionados. Con esa tristeza y con esa decepción no se puede reconocer al Resucitado caminando a nuestro lado. Por eso ellos pensaron que era otra persona. No fueron capaces de ver al Señor, “sus ojos no eran capaces de reconocerle”. ¿Cuántas veces vamos “ciegos” por la vida sin reconocer al Señor Resucitado que camina con nosotros?

Ya que con los ojos no pudieron reconocerle, el Señor prueba con los oídos. “Y les explicó lo que se refería a Él en toda la Escritura”. Parece que aquí consiguió un poco más, porque aquellos discípulos reconocieron después que, en esos momentos, “les ardía el corazón”. Aun así, seguían incapaces para reconocerle. Finalmente, Jesús se sienta a la mesa con ellos. A ver si por el gusto (o por el estómago) conseguía “ganárselos”. “Tomó el pan, pronunció la bendición, LO PARTIÓ y se lo dio”. Y entonces sí: “A ellos se les abrieron los ojos y le reconocieron”. Y también los oídos, el paladar, el tacto y todos los sentidos. Era su gesto característico: partir el pan. Les había reunido tantas veces alrededor de una mesa y había compartido con ellos ese gesto que, al hacerlo de nuevo, ya no había dudas, era inconfundible. Le reconocieron “al partir el pan”. Jesús hizo con ellos una larga misa, que empezó por el camino con la Palabra y que terminó en la Fracción del Pan en la casa. ¿Qué hacer después de aquella celebración, de aquel encuentro? ¿A qué nos invita el Señor después de venir a Misa?

Estos dos hombres se hacen misioneros, van a anunciar que Jesús se apareció ahí en su villa, caminando y partiendo el Pan. Al igual que nosotros estamos invitados hoy a anunciar la Resurrección, Jesús esta vivo, no muerto.

Lo que vemos hacer a Pedro en la primera lectura es lo que empiezan a hacer todos. “Pedro, con los Once, levantó la voz y les dirigió la palabra: escuchadme, israelitas: les hablo de Jesús Nazareno... ustedes, lo entregaron y ustedes... lo mataron en una cruz. Pero Dios lo resucitó, rompiendo las ataduras de la muerte”. Es el kerigma primitivo sobre Jesús, el anuncio de la Buena Noticia que cambia las vidas de aquellos pescadores humildes y de todos los que los oyen y acogen esta Buena Noticia. ¿Y qué tenemos que hacer?, preguntaban muchos. “Tomar en serio nuestro proceder en esta vida”. Así se lo dice San Pedro a los cristianos de su comunidad en la carta que les escribe y que hemos leído en la segunda lectura.

Cambieemos nuestra tristeza y nuestra pasividad por la alegría y el ardor misionero. Seamos nosotros también los valientes discípulos misioneros que anuncian, con su manera de proceder en esta vida, que Jesús Resucitado ha cambiado nuestras vidas de una manera radical. Reconozcámosle en su Palabra, que hace arder nuestro corazón, en los hermanos que celebran con nosotros, y también en los que sufren y en los pobres. Pero sobre todo, reconozcámosle al partir el pan y comulguemos con la confianza de que es Él, el Resucitado, que nos sienta a la mesa, para después enviarnos a la vida. Vivamos y pongamos en práctica la Resurrección. Amen. Aleluya!!!!

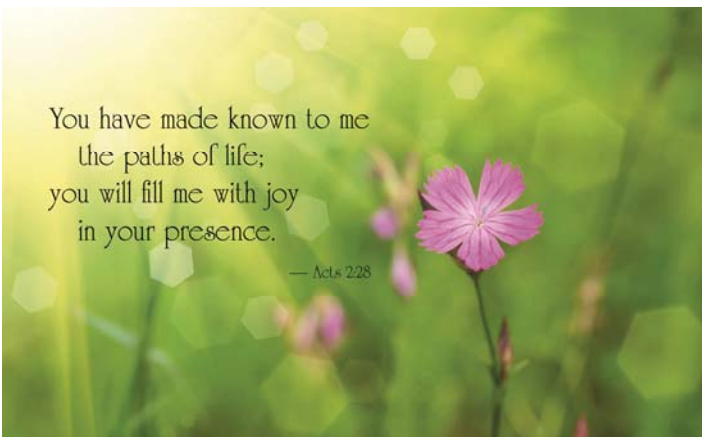


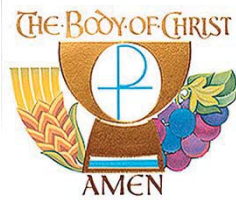
