TRABAJAR POR EL REINO

La palabra de Dios estos domingos nos viene con una invitación directa a nuestras vidas, somos la tierra que el Señor ha creado y nuestra misión es cuidar de ella y hacerla producir. Las parábolas nos están llamando la atención sobre qué tipo de tierras somos, que tipo de semillas y cuáles son nuestros frutos.

Jesús trato de hacer comprender a los demás a sus oyentes en qué consistía y que era el Reino de los cielos y por eso usa las comparaciones o parábolas con los elementos más rutinarios de las personas. El campo era uno de ellos y las siembras también.

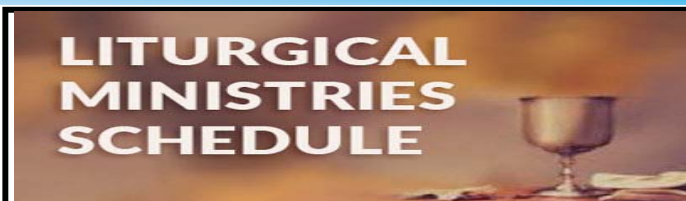
En el evangelio de hoy hay nada menos que tres parábolas o comparaciones de lo que es el Reino: la buena semilla sembrada en el campo, el grano de mostaza y la levadura. Las tres nos hablan de vida y de crecimiento, pero también del peligro que acecha e impide la realización del reino de Dios. Porque el Reino "no es de este mundo", pero comienza aquí en este mundo, aunque todavía no ha llegado a su plenitud. Es el "ya, pero todavía no". Jesús dejó bien claro que su Reino no es como los reinos de este mundo. En él es primero el que es último, es decir el que sirve, no el que tiene el poder. Muchas veces quisieron hacer rey a Jesús, pero El lo rechazó porque había venido a servir y no a ser servido. Su mesianismo no es político ni espectacular, sino silencioso y humilde

Todos somos responsables de la transformación de este mundo. La consecuencia que se deriva del establecimiento del Reino en este mundo es que tenemos que trabajar para que haya unas condiciones de vida en las que reine la justicia, la paz y la fraternidad. Mientras esto no se consiga, no podemos estar contentos. No debemos huir del mundo, sino implicarnos en su transformación aquí y ahora, sin esperar a que llegue pasivamente el "Reino de los cielos".

La parábola de la cizaña es una enseñanza justa, precisa y muy importante. El Hijo de Dios nos recuerda que el mal existe y que quien lo siembra es el Maligno. El texto del Evangelio de Mateo es claro, conciso e inequívoco. Es verdad que asistimos a muchos episodios de maldad humana y ello nos puede llevar a suponer que es una realidad contingente y cercana, solo imputable al hombre. Por ello, entonces, podríamos suponer que la bondad es obra nuestra también y que solo es generada por nuestro buen corazón. Tampoco es así. La semilla de bondad que reina en nuestras almas ha sido plantada por Dios, por medio de la Palabra –el Verbo– que es su Hijo.

El mal es una realidad en nuestras vidas, pero no quiere decir que las personas deben vivir haciendo el mal, Dios nos ha dado un ejemplo en Jesucristo de amor, perdón, aceptación etc. Somos responsables de crear un mundo mejor cada día, de llevar la paz, alegría, de sembrar la bondad y la esperanza y eso lo podemos hacer cada una y uno de nosotros. Eso no esta lejos de nuestras posibilidades, siembra buena semilla en tu vida, en tu familia, cuidala y dara frutos de bondad , justicia, paz y amor en abundancia. El mundo necesita de que aprendamos a vencer el mal a fuerza de hacer el bien. Nuestra invitación este domingo y esta semana es hacer actos de buenas obras en medio de las situaciones que no lo son. Pero el mal no podrá si el bien se hace presente por medio nuestro. Seamos la buena semilla. Paz y bien.

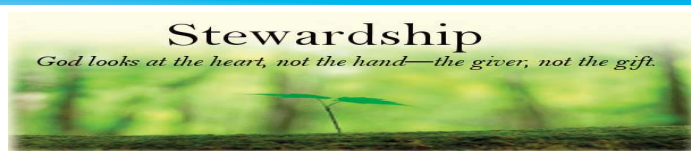

Special Days in August

During the month of August our church will celebrate three very special saints. August 11th—St. Clare of Assisi. She

Transfiguration

On Saturday August 6, we celebrate the Feast of the Transfiguration of the Lord. It is a day of eyewitness accounts. The first, a vision reported by the prophet Daniel, was well known to Jesus and his apostles. The vision account was written in quite mystical and figurative language. It is a vision of heaven, powerful and memorable. There are flames of fire, burning wheels, the Ancient One, and a Son of Man. Clearly, Daniel saw something. But was it a dream? Was it real? Was it merely a clever myth? Peter wants no such confusion about his vision! We are told in Mark's Gospel what he and his friends James and John saw when they went up on the mountain with Jesus one day. Jesus warned the three witnesses to tell no one until "the Son of Man had risen from the dead" (Mark 9:9). Lest readers of one of the Gospels discount the story or simply write it off as a pious myth. Peter gives his own account of the Transfiguration of Jesus in his second letter to the church. He writes with authority, as an eyewitness. He reports this message from God concerning Jesus: "This is my Son, my beloved, with whom I am well pleased," and he assures us that the message is "altogether reliable" (2 Peter 1:17, 19).
